A barcamp "unconference" is simply a space to open up the public sphere conversation - to create a comfortable place where new thinking becomes possible and enables new outcomes. There are no long presentations and the topics are yours - **you get to create the agenda.**

- ◆ Policy 2.0: Why do apps have all the fun?



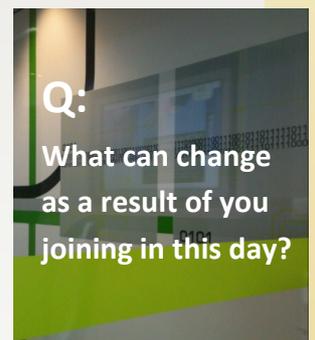
Gov 2.0 and public innovation: International guest **Dominic Campbell**, founder **FutureGov**, will share learnings from the UK and United States.
